New Hospital School in Hinckley

A new school has opened in Hinckley which helps young people return to their mainstream school.

The Children's Hospital School has launched The Phoenix Learning Centre at the Atkins Building.

The centre offers 12-week placements for young people aged 11-16 who have been unable to attend school for health reasons, mostly anxiety and other mental health conditions.

Children who are inpatients at the Leicester Royal Infirmary and the Beacon Adolescent Inpatient Unit at Glenfield Hospital are also taught by the school.

The new base has been established because of increasing referral numbers in the area. It means children referred in Hinckley and Bosworth will no longer have to travel to Leicester for their education.

It improves students' chances of successfully reintegrating back to their school if they remain in their community. A base in Hinckley also reduces travel times, costs and associated impacts on the environment.

Stephen Deadman, Executive Headteacher at The Children's Hospital School, said: "We are delighted to open a new learning centre within the Atkins Building to support those from the local area who are unable to attend their school due to physical and / or mental health

Local health organisations in our area are encouraging parents and carers to get in the know about the best ways to prevent pesky bugs from making their little ones poorly this winter.

With coughs, colds and tummy bugs in infants and children on the rise at this time of the year, Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust, the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Integrated Care Board (LLR ICB) and Leicester Hospitals

have teamed up to create new online winter wellness hubs on the Health for Under 5s and Health for Kids websites.

The hubs have lots of articles and advice on how to avoid getting ill and when and where to go for help if kids do become unwell. What's more, all the content has been put together by trusted NHS health professionals, including doctors and nurses and contains advice on how to find local support.

Dr Louise Ryan, GP clinical lead for children and young people for LLR ICB, said: "We know how worrying it is when your child gets ill.

> "We want to help parents and carers to easily find the advice they need and feel confident about when to seek further medical help if it's needed, especially as it can also be a really busy time of year in GP practices and hospitals.

> "There are so many things you can do to reduce the likelihood of getting poorly; things like prioritising vaccinations, adopting healthy habits, and encouraging good hand hygiene all help."

Local MP Raises Concerns

Dr Luke Evans, Member of Parliament for Hinckley and Bosworth, has again spoken in Parliament about the failure of Liberal Democrat-run Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council to implement an up-to-date Local Plan, which is now compounded by the Labour Government's imposed 59% increase to local housebuilding targets.

Dr Luke highlighted that this seems "*unfair*" to people in rural areas when transport connections and amenities are already in place in cities, such as Leicester.

The Housing Minister responded that Local Plans are the *"best way for communities to control development in their areas,"* and said that he would work with the local MP to ensure Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council can secure an up-to-date Local Plan.

A Local Plan provides the necessary protections for infrastructure in our area, such as roads, GP surgeries and school places.

The GP-turned-MP has been campaigning for stronger protections for Neighbourhood Plans, which he says are the "*next best way to protect villages*" from overbuilding but are "*ridden roughshod over*" when areas such as Hinckley and Bosworth don't have an up-to-date Local Plan in place.

Dr Evans has been able to secure an increase to the statutory period at which a Neighbourhood Plan needs to be reviewed, from two years to five years.

Dr Luke Evans, Member of Parliament for Hinckley and Bosworth, said "Under the previous Government I successfully





campaigned for the housebuilding algorithm to prioritise brown field sites and cities with infrastructure, such as Leicester, over green field sites which can be used for agricultural purposes.

"So I have been disappointed to see the Labour Government reverse this necessary change, with housebuilding in Hinckley and Bosworth set to increase by 59% and in North West Leicestershire by 74%, while targets for Leicester City fall by -31%.

"The new Government's changes to the planning framework increases pressure on rural areas like ours and makes little sense. We should be building on brown field sites and in areas that already have good transport connections and services.

"This is compounded by the fact that Liberal Democrat-run Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council have failed to implement an up-to-date Local Plan over the last five years.

"Not having an up-to-date Local Plan places even more pressure on our infrastructure and means that Neighbourhood Plans, made by local people who have given their time to formulate them, are ridden roughshod over."

January – the Fresh Start Effect

It's January and, as always for many, that means lifestyle changes. Many new-year's resolutions involve getting fit, losing weight and changing eating habits.

Try out a class and turn up early to speak to the instructor.

Leicester Animal Aid

Those who visit Leicester Animal Aid in search of their next four-legged friend often ask staff at The Charity whether the end of lockdown caused a surge in animals given up



for adoption. The answer is a bit more complex than just numbers and it may surprise you.

Since the pandemic, The Charity has seen an increase in stray dogs admitted to the Centre via the dog warden. An even bigger trend is that dogs who come into Charity's care, because their current owners can no longer look after them, are under-socialised and more anxious than ever before.

Enrichment is an important part of animal rehoming, and it can really help a dog (or cat) to settle. The term 'enrichment' simply means putting training plans, fun activities and positive interactions (both human and animal) in place to make an animal's life fulfilling and rewarding. Laying special scent trails for dogs and doing Free Work (where a dog explores interesting objects like snuffle mats, Kongs and even upturned cardboard boxes) can help to build a dog's confidence. It also makes the most of their natural curiosity. Cruz (pictured below) is a twoyear-old, male, German Shepherd/Rottweiler who has been particularly responsive to training due to the intelligence of his breed and his strong bond with kennel staff.



All dogs are different, of course, and encouragement in the shape of a tasty treat or two can make all the difference. The Charity is grateful for support from the local community but not everyone thinks of treats as something that is needed and used daily. High value treats in the shape of hot dog sausages, squeezy cheese, meat snacks and pate really make training easier and more rewarding for animals.

Could you help? The Charity gratefully welcomes donations of training treats and wet food. They have a wish list available on their website at leicesteranimalaid.org.uk/wishlist The Charity also has an Amazon Wish List where kind supporters living further afield can request



items to be delivered to the Centre from the comfort of their own homes.

For animals like Cruz, these kind donations from animal-loving supporters make all the difference.

Bring on Burns Night!

January may feel like a bit of an empty month after all the December festivities of Christmas and New Year.

But for those with any kind of Scottish roots (or just those who want something to celebrate), then Burns Night is coming on Saturday, January 25 – so get your haggis, bagpipes and tartan ready!

The Scottish important national cultural day celebrates the life and work of Robert Burns, a famous poet who is known all over the world.

Burns Night is often celebrated with a Burns supper which usually includes haggis, neeps and tatties.

Haggis is like a big crumbly sausage, neeps are better known as swedes, and you might have guessed that tatties are potatoes!

A good haggis made by brands like Macsween, Grants and Simon Howie can be purchased at local supermarkets including Aldi, Tesco and M&S.

During this supper, parts of Burns' poetry will be recited too.



A Burns supper consists of lots of different parts, and there are bits that most people include, although everyone will have their own variations.

The 'Selkirk Grace' usually opens the meal, after the host has welcomed everyone and said a few words.

The main event, the haggis, will arrive to a flurry of bagpipes, after which 'Address to a Haggis' is usually recited before it's eaten.

Other bits of Burns' poetry may get recited as the night goes on, and the Auld Lang Syne can be sung at the end.


