

clinical specialities in more modern facilities.

Hinckley and Bosworth MP urges Labour Government to not override local concerns on Hinckley rail hub

Following the Chancellor's recent speech on growth Dr Luke Evans, Member of Parliament for Hinckley and Bosworth, has urged the Labour Government not to deviate from protocols and policy on looming decision for the Hinckley National Rail Freight Interchange (NRFI).

Dr Evans, MP since December 2019, said the "Labour Government shouldn't push through their growth agenda on the backs of people in Hinckley and Bosworth."

Dr Evans reiterated concerns raised with him by people in Hinckley and Bosworth that the Chancellor's recent comments could lead to the Hinckley NRFI being pushed through despite serious concerns over the impact on roads, safety, and the local environment, particularly Burbage Common.


The GP-turned-MP called on the new Transport Secretary to stick to protocols for decisionmaking on large infrastructure projects and follow the Planning Inspectorate's previous recommendation to reject the application.

The Transport Secretary's final decision is expected to be made by 10th March 2025.

Dr Luke Evans, Member of Parliament for Hinckley and Bosworth, added "After the Chancellor's comments, I am concerned that the Transport Secretary's decision on the proposed Hinckley NRFI will overlook the many deficiencies with this application and not give due weight to the considerable concerns of people across our area or those raised by the independent Planning Inspectorate.

"If this decision is given the green light, it will be hard not to think the new Government's change of policy is behind the rail hub being accepted, not the merits of the project itself which we know to be flawed.

"I'd like to thank all those in the community



who have helped fight this application and exposed the flaws in the proposal, let's hope the new Transport Secretary has the same thoughts as the last, and actually refuses it once and for all."

From Breakdown to Brass Band

For Hinckley musician Chris Small the setting up of a brass band was what helped his recovery from a mental health breakdown.

Chris says he had reached *"absolute crisis"* point and was unsure what his future held. But joining up with a group of fellow brass instrument players helped him become his old self again.

You may have seen the quartet carolling in the Hinckley area in the run-up to Christmas to raise money for the Mind mental health charity. And they have also recorded a CD of Christmas music to raise money for the charity.

Chris, who studied music at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire and plays a range of instruments including the euphonium and trombone, said: "Just over 12 months ago I had a mental breakdown and I was in absolute crisis.

"I reached out to Mind and asked them for some help and they pointed me in lots of different directions.

"If it wasn't for Mind I probably wouldn't be here now working on this project."

Chris, who has been playing music since he was eight, added: *"What for me was a small lightbulb moment, to get some friends together to do some carolling, has become something absolutely amazing.*

"I can't describe how much music has meant to me and helped me get back on the road to being 100 per cent Chris again.

"This whole project means a lot to me personally and it is an opportunity to put a bit of a stamp down and to say, 'it's been really hard, but now I'm back'."

He said his recovery was ongoing and that it had been a privilege to play with a group of great musicians and friends.

Chris added: "I hope we are putting a smile on people's faces."

Thieves Rob Community Hospital

Thousands of pounds worth of equipment has been stolen from a Hinckley community hospital.

It's believed a group of people broke into a premises that is currently under construction at the hospital site.

They stole thousands of pounds worth of copper wiring and caused a significant amount of damage.

Four men were arrested after the burglary within the grounds of Hinckley and District General Hospital.

Police received a report of a suspicious vehicle within the grounds of the Mount Road site around 12.55 am on Tuesday 28th January.

When officers arrived at the scene one of the two suspect vehicles was seen leaving the site and failed to stop for them. That vehicle was last seen heading along Rugby Road in Burbage.

The four men have all since been released on police bail pending further enquiries.

Sergeant Fiona Day from Hinckley Neighbourhood Policing Area, said: "Our investigation remains ongoing and are currently looking through CCTV and carrying out house to house enquiries in the area.

"It is sad that a community resource has been targeted in this way and no doubt this incident will have an impact on the ongoing work on the site.



"We would urge anyone who may have witnessed what happened or saw people or vehicles acting suspiciously around the area at this time. Also, if you were driving in the Rugby Road area of Burbage and captured any footage on your dashcam equipment of a vehicle driving at speed through the area we would like to speak to you."

Appeal after tiny puppies abandoned

Blaby District Council is appealing for information after a litter of eight tiny puppies were dumped at an industrial estate in Enderby.

The puppies, barely two weeks old, were found on Monday 20 January on Quarry Lane by a driver from Castle

Freight. He spotted a box as he was driving into the firm's gates around lunchtime.

The cross-breed pups were first taken to a vet before being handed to the Council's partners Animal Care Services.

Luckily the pups were found to be healthy, despite their trauma, and were taken to a rescue centre. New homes have already been found for them.

The callous incident has prompted an investigation by the Council with officers keen to hear from anyone who may be able to help.

Councillor Les Phillimore, Blaby District Council Portfolio Holder for Environmental Services, said: "These poor animals have not had the best start in life, to be discarded like trash in near freezing temperatures just weeks after birth is nothing other than cruel and heartless. Thankfully they were found before any real harm could come to them and swift rescue action ensured their ordeal was limited. I'm delighted they are healthy and have been found new homes.

"The heartless abandonment, however, is not



something that can be overlooked. We are appealing to anyone to get in touch who may have information as to the culprits or knows anything about the circumstances of the dumping. We take animal cruelty extremely seriously and will not hesitate to bring criminal charges should we uncover enough evidence."

Anyone who was in the area between 11.30am and 2.30pm on 20 January and saw anything unusual or perhaps has dashcam footage, CCTV or door camera footage of the location is asked to contact the Council. Depending on evidence gathered the Council could bring charges under the Animal Welfare Act 2006.

Hard Hitting Letter Presses Government for Flood Help

Councils across Leicestershire joined forces to press the Government to release cash to help flood-hit residents.

Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council Leader, Stuart Bray, was one of the signatories of the letter.

The hard-hitting letter called for immediate cash to support those forced to leave their homes and urges a national flooding shake up.

The move came as the number of homes flooded on Monday 6 January hit 630 and continued to rise - surpassing numbers seen during Storm Henk 12 months ago.

The letter - sent to Minister for Water and Flooding, Emma Hardy MP - stressed the devastating impact on residents and businesses.

It said: "This is the second year in a row where hundreds of residents are left homeless and local pubs, sports clubs and others do not know if they will be able to survive. Many are cleaning up after just getting on their feet after Storm Henk battered the area just 12 months ago. Residents sought shelter and support a in emergency rest centres, many with just the clothes they were wearing. It is a torrid situation.

"The right thing is for Government to release funding now and activate the Flood Recovery Framework to help them survive and get back to some kind of normality."

Emergency services, councils, NHS, voluntary agencies and worked round the clock to keep people safe and declared a major incident.

During the response Leicestershire Fire and Rescue Services received 380 calls, rescued more than 60 people from properties and 27 from cars by boat.

Leicestershire Police handled over 2,100 calls - a 40 to 50 per cent rise on average daily demand and East Midlands Ambulance Service declared



a critical incident.

The letter also calls on Government to drive national changes, including help for homeowners to make properties more flood resilient, support for businesses to get insurance and a new national communications campaign.

It states: "Our climate is changing and we need a new approach. We are seeing far more frequent events, causing greater impact and affecting areas never historically known to flood. National changes to funding and powers are required to help us better prevent and then react to flooding when it does occur.
