

Act Now for a VE Day Street Party

Local communities are being encouraged to apply for free road closures to host street parties to celebrate the 80th anniversary of VE Day in May.

The historic anniversary, commemorating the end of the Second World War in Europe, takes place on Thursday 8 May, and celebrations are being planned across the country across the weekend from Thursday 8 to Sunday 11 May.

Leicestershire County Council is waiving the usual fee for closing roads in order to hold events, to help support communities and groups who want to organise events.

The deadline for applications for a free road closure to allow a celebration of the 80th anniversary of VE Day to be held is Friday, 21 March.

Councillor Ozzy O'Shea, cabinet member for highways, said: "The 80th anniversary of VE Day is an historic event for the country - and the country of Leicestershire.

"We want to help people to celebrate and encourage communities to come together to mark this special occasion, so we'll be waiving road closure fees.

"However, if you are planning an event, such



as a street party, you will need to let us know in good time, so that the necessary arrangements can be put in place."

The council is also offering free loans of signs and cones for event organisers, which will need to be collected from and returned to the Mountsorrel Highways Depot. These also need to be applied for by the deadline of Friday 21 March.

Guidance on organising an event and an application for a road closure is available on the county council's highways pages or by e-mailing eventsnetworkmanagement@leics.gov.uk

Communities across Leicestershire are invited to get involved in the commemorations by hosting parties of celebration throughout the day in the streets, gardens, churches, town halls, pubs, and clubs.

Rail Hub Refusal Welcomed

News that the Government has refused permission for a massive new Rail Hub on land near Junction 2 of the M69 near Burbage has been welcomed by local politicians.

The Secretary of State has turned down planning permission for the scheme from developers Tritax Symmetry to build on 650 acres of land close to Burbage Common.

Dr Luke Evans, Member of Parliament for Hinckley and Bosworth, said: "What a huge success for our community! After years of this hanging over us, and all the hard



work from everyone in our area, we've finally had confirmed what we knew all along; this project is inappropriate.

"This will be a huge relief for many people across our area. Any perceived benefit of the Hinckley NRFI was clearly outweighed by the construction and operation of this site, and I'm so pleased to see it has been rejected.

"The impact this would have had is so significant I am pleased the Government has finally heard the concerns from Councils, infrastructure groups, the Planning Inspectorate, environmental campaigners, the

public and local MPs, and seen sense to turn down the proposal.

"While the developers still have a chance to appeal the decision, I hope they choose not to, given the strength of feeling and the substance of the Planning Inspector's report.

"I would personally like to say thank you again to everyone who gave their time and effort to make their objections known, I know it's been a long road but we finally did it!"



Hinckley councillor Michael Mullaney, who campaigned against the plans, has also welcomed the news.

He said: "I'm delighted that the Freight Depot plans have been turned down. For years we have fought plans for a rail freight depot locally. The Freight depot would have blighted Burbage Common and added huge numbers of lorries to overstretched local roads.

"A big thanks to all the local residents who supported the campaign to stop it. This is really welcome news"



On Track for May Opening of Diagnostics Hub

Plans are on track for Hinckley's new diagnostics hub to open in May, according to an NHS body.

The Leicester. Leicestershire and Rutland Integrated Care Board (LLR ICB) said the £24.6m facility would provide about 89,000 diagnostic tests per year in Hinckley.

These tests will include CT and MRI scans, endoscopy, X-ray and ultrasounds, delivered by the University Hospitals of Leicester (UHL) NHS Trust.

Construction on the site has been under way since April last year at Hinckley and District Community Hospital.

The LLR ICB said "significant progress has been made" over recent weeks, despite a January break-in at the site, for which four men were arrested.

Helen Hendley, director of planned care for the LLR ICB, said: "We've made great progress



on the new facility, which will make a big difference to local people when it opens.

"It will help to reduce waiting times and provide a more convenient facility for people in the community.

"Providing services closer to people's homes and where they work improves access to health services. We're excited to see the positive difference this facility will make."

The other hub in the county - at Leicester General Hospital - has been running since 2021.

Christian Aid Spring Fayre at St Mary's


Ahead of Christian Aid Week, which takes place in May, a Christian Aid Spring Fayre is being held at a Hinckley church in April.



Doorstep Scammers Operating in Hinckley

Area

An urgent warning has been issued after fraudsters were reported to be targeting homes in the Hinckley area.

Trading Standards officials said doorstep traders had been coldcalling properties and attempting to pressure residents into immediate roof repairs.



They are advising homeowners to be cautious when answering their doors to unexpected callers. They have also warned residents to never pay in cash or make full upfront payments.

A spokesperson for Leicestershire Trading Standards said: "If you are unsure of who is knocking at your door, do not answer. If you



open the door to a cold caller, keep the door chain on and shut the door at any time to end the conversation."

The authority is asking residents to note down the time, descriptions of persons including clothing and any vehicle details if safe to do so. Trading Standards said anyone who feels threatened or intimidated should call 999.

Residents are also being asked to inform their neighbours if they are able to do so. Anyone seeking advice or wanting to report suspicious activity should call Trading Standards on 0808 223 1133.

Keep Dogs Under Control at Bradgate Park

As spring begins to bloom in the coming weeks and months more people in the area are likely to take the opportunity for a stroll in Bradgate Park, Leicestershire's only Medieval Deer Park.

With over 830 acres, steeped in history and teeming with wonderful wildlife, it's the perfect location to get back in touch with nature.

However, dog owners are being asked to keep their pets under control at all times and

to be mindful of the wildlife at the nature spot as multiple deer have died recently.

A spokesperson for the park said: "We've had multiple incidents recently where dogs have chased wildlife, resulting in the tragic death of four deer in just the past month!

"A high-speed chase can stress and injure animals, sometimes fatally, especially when they are forced to flee for their lives."

Dog owners are therefore being asked to keep pets under control at all times, especially in the



upper area of the park.

Park representatives added: "Be mindful of wildlife, especially in areas where deer are present. Wildlife protection is a shared responsibility.

"If you're walking or letting your dog run off the lead in the upper area of the Park, please ensure they are kept under control at all times."

Plans for the First Services on the M69

Plans for the first services on the M69, by the A5 at Burbage, have been approved by one of the two councils required.

Welcome Break wants to create petrol stations, a main building with fast food, coffee and convenience shops, a gaming zone, seating, toilets and showers, and units for drivethrough businesses to use.

Despite traffic concerns, Hinckley and Bosworth

Borough Council gave its blessing to the development, off the Stretton Baskerville Roundabout on the A5 at Burbage, at a meeting on 18 February.

The site, currently an unused former compound, sits on the border of Leicestershire and Warwickshire, so approval is also required from Rugby Borough Council.

Rugby council currently expects to rule on the plan by this month and the meeting heard the Warwickshire authority is set to approve the development "shortly".

Welcome Break said the facility would create the equivalent of about 120 full-time jobs.

Businesses named in the plans include KFC, Starbucks, Burger King and Pret A Manger.

The services at junction 1 would have 272 car



parking spaces, picnic and dog walking facilities, and parking for HGVs, coaches, caravans and motorbikes.

These would include 37 charging stations for electric vehicles, Welcome Break said.

Some councillors expressed concerns over the impact on the A5.

The vote to approve the plans was almost unanimous, with only one councillor choosing to abstain.

The road, which links Leicester and Coventry, opened in 1977 but has never had a formal service station.

Currently, motorists using the M69 have to exit the motorway to find petrol and facilities, or wait to reach Leicester Forest East on the M1 or Corley on the M6.
